The Charlotte Teachers Institute

The Charlotte Teachers Institute (CTI) is designed to strengthen teaching and learning in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg public school system (CMS). Based on a model that began over 35 years ago at Yale University, CTI offers CMS teachers the unique opportunity to participate in intensive, content-based, multi-disciplinary seminars led by faculty at UNC Charlotte and Davidson College.

Each year, CTI teacher-leaders canvass their colleagues for topic ideas to ensure CTI's eight, concurrent, seven-month-long seminars will fulfill teacher interest and build relevant content knowledge. In each seminar, 13 preK-12 CMS teachers (CTI Fellows) from diverse grade levels and subject areas meet weekly to explore the seminar topic. Seminars convene in Spring and Fall, with a summer recess for independent research related to the topic.

CTI's collaborative seminars help teachers better understand their subjects and think creatively about how to implement new curriculum into their classrooms. Successful completion of a seminar requires each Fellow, with guidance from the seminar leader, to write a curriculum unit to be used in his/her own classroom and to be shared with other teachers within the district and nationally. Fellows receive three continuing education credits and a \$1,500 stipend for their full participation.

Seminars work to accomplish three goals:

- 1. Build teacher content-knowledge.
- 2. Encourage educational collaboration among teachers and college/university faculty.
- 3. Support teachers as they write new curriculum, based on seminar content, to implement in their classrooms.
