

Four Central Features of a Community of Philosophical Inquiry: (Mohr-Lone and Burroughs, pp. 54-55)

- 1- Structured collaborative inquiry aimed at building meaning and acquiring understanding through the examination of philosophical questions or concepts of interest to the participants
- 2- "epistemological modesty" an acknowledgement that all members of the group, including the facilitator, are fallible.
- 3- Refrain from using too much technical philosophical language or direct references to the work of professional philosophers to contract their arguments.
- 4- Establishment of an environment of intellectual safety, where any question or comment is acceptable as long as it does not belittle or devalue others in the group and allows trust and willingness to present one's thoughts to participants.
